2022 MEET PREVIEW

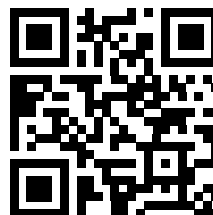
This weekend marks the 57th annual Jesuit-Sheaner Relays, hosted by Jesuit Dallas. This year's meet features the largest field since 2019 and includes a jam-packed field that will highlight the best competitors in Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

One of the top runners appearing at this year's meet is Wylie senior Logan Popelka. Heading into the weekend, Popelka holds the top 400-meter dash time in the nation (46.66) along with the best 200-meter time (20.96) in the Metroplex. The 400-meter dash should feature some fireworks and meet records could be in jeopardy as Popelka will match up against Killeen Shoemaker's Hassan Wilkerson, who was the top-ranked runner in the event last season, and Garrett Kaalund from San Antonio Antonian, who enters the event with a 46.88 seed time.

Killeen Shoemaker will also look to make a splash in the 4x100 meter relay, as the Wolves enter a team ranked fifth in the state. However, state-ranked No. 21 Longview and a Jesuit Dallas squad that has already set two school records this season look to put their stamp on this year's meet. The jam-packed 4x400 meter run will spotlight four top-20 teams, including No. 4 Duncanville, No. 9 DeSoto in the 6A boys' race and No. 12 Allen, No. 18 Prosper and an Edmond Memorial team from Oklahoma that ranked second in the Sooner State during indoor track & field season, and has aspirations for a state championship in 2022.

Claire Lowrey from Rockwall will be one of the spotlighted athletes during the field events, entering the meet ranked atop the state leaders and is second in the nation in the high jump. Earlier this year, Lowrey broke a school record by clearing the bar at 5'11" and could threaten the meet record of 5'9" set in 2014. The Lone Star state could feel the impact from several out-of-state competitors, as Tyjuan Huffman from Beebe H.S. (Ark.) is ranked fourth in the long jump and Adrian Carranco, also from Beebe, finished the indoor season ranked third in the state in the triple jump.

On Friday, crowded field will compete in the 3200-meter run at 6:30 p.m. The race will feature four runners ranked in the area top 10 as Enrique Borrego (Jesuit), Cullen McCaleb (Lakehill Prep), Anthony Navarro (Hebron) and Nathaniel Berhane (Wylie) will duke it out in the first event of the meet. On the girls' side, Allie Love from Colleyville Heritage is the top-ranked runner in the state and the No. 14-ranked runner in the nation with a 10:41.74 seed time.



ABOUT THE JESUIT-SHEANER RELAYS

The Jesuit-Sheaner Relays began with three objectives; provide a first class venue for track & field where athletes can benefit from top facilities and competition, promote high school track & field to area fans and media in order to build broader interest in the sport, and provide maximum exposure and recognition to North Texas fans of top individuals and teams.

The Relays were first run in 1964 on a new all-weather track at Jesuit Dallas. The track was the first of its kind in Texas and attracted high schools, junior colleges and universities from across the state to participate in the inaugural meet. High schools continue to travel from all parts of Texas and neighboring states to participate in what has become one of the finest high school track & field meets in Texas. The meet was a boys' only high school track & field meet with 6A and 5A & lower divisions competing separately until 2014 when

the girls' division was added. A strong emphasis is placed on the 17 UIL state meet events allowing schools to prepare for district, regional and state competition.

Jesuit Relays was renamed the Jesuit-Sheaner Relays in 1975 upon the retiring of long time track coach Herb Sheaner. Coach Sheaner served in World War II and received the Bronze Star and Purple Heart during the Battle of the Bulge (where he was captured and placed in a German prison camp). He became the track & field and cross country coach at Jesuit in 1955. This followed a track career at the University of Texas in the 1940s under the longhorns' legendary coach, Clyde Littlefield. In addition to establishing the Jesuit-Sheaner Relays, coach Sheaner organized and hosted Dallas' first high school cross country meet in 1958 and the first T.C.I.L. State track meet in 1957.
